




Utah Centennial County History Series (29 volume set) Salt Lake City, UT: Utah State Historical Society, 1996-1999. First edition.

Octavos [23.5 cm] All volumes bound in blue vinyl cloth over boards with gilt titles on the front boards and backstrips. All but one volume are in the publisher's unopened shrink-wrap.

These volumes were published to coincide with the Utah's state centennial. The print runs for these volumes fluctuated greatly, with some printings selling out shortly after publication. An important set written by leading Utah scholars.

776pp. Octavo [23.5 cm.] Original green and white cloth with an illustration of Joseph Smith on the front cover. Very good. The covers are rubbed and subtly bumped. The front pastedown has a previous owner's bookplate. The edges of p. 9 are slightly chipped, and a one inch closed tear in the bottom edge has been backed with tape.

First editions of this title are sought after, due to the fact that later editions of this popular Latter-day Saints doctrinal reference had some of McConkie's more controversial statements removed.





376pp. 3/4 leather binding over marbled boards. Two pages have clip from bottom right hand edge. Darkish stain also runs across the lower right hand edges of all pages; approx. one inch high. One of 26 volumes issued in this series prior to their being replaced by the annual conference reports. Flake #4504.

Volume one of the original printing of the *Journal of Discourses*.






Ruess, Everett

80pp. Quarto [26 cm] Tan cloth with the title gilt stamped on the front board. A few small nicks at the corners of the jacket. A small piece of the jacket is chipped at the foot of the rear panel. Scotch tape on the reverse of the jacket at the head and foot and near the folds. Overall a clean example of this usually tattered jacket. Foreword by Randall Henderson. Introduction by Hugh Lacy. Illustrated with facsimiles of Ruess block prints and photographs.

This work was published sixteen years after Ruess disappeared in the wilds of Southern Utah. The mystery surrounding artist and poet Everett Ruess (1914-1934) continues to the present day. Ruess, who loved to explore the expansive lands of the West, disappeared in the wilderness of Utah in 1934. No trace of him has ever been found. Farquhar 119b





Number 465 of 897. Other contributors include Ezra Taft Benson, Marvin J. Ashton, and Bruce R. McConkie.





828pp. Octavo [24 cm] Blue cloth boards with gilt stamped titles on the spine and front cover. Modern endsheets and flyleaves. The covers are gently rubbed and bumped. There are multiple very small stains on the top edge of the text block, and the fore edge and bottom edges of the text block have several thin light marks. The longest mark is on the fore edge and measures 4 inches long.

Flake 4413. LDS Church historian, Andrew Jenson, authored numerous biographies and historical works, including the *LDS Biographical Encyclopedia*, *Church Chronology, Historical Record* and many other works in English and Danish.





624pp. Large octavo [25 cm] Black cloth. All 26 issues published June 24, 1930 - June 9, 1931. The front cover is slightly soiled, and the rear board is very heavily stained. The spine is rolled, and the spine ends and corners of the covers are gently bumped. The gilt stamped title on the spine is a bit rubbed. The endsheets are lightly stained, and there is a previous owner's name on the front free endsheet.

Scarce depression era issues. A comprehensive collection of LDS material centered around Latterday Saint missionary activities during the great depression.







The spine of volume 1 is very slightly rolled back, and the top edge of jacket is gently bumped. The dust jacket of volume 2 is in very good condition. There is some blue staining at the bottom of the jacket on the interior at the spine.

336pp. Duodecimo [19.5 cm] Light greenish-gray cloth covered boards with gilt stamped titles and a light blue ink stamped design of the temple on the front board. Top edge gilt. Decorative floral endpapers. The extremities are gently bumped. The text block is pulling away from the spine and it is cracked multiple times. The gatherings at the rear are loose. There is a contemporary owner's name on the second front flyleaf.

Original edition of 1912 which includes the plate 'Holy of Holies.' With 46 full page photographs of the Mormon Temple by the C.R. Savage photographic firm. Plate 27, the "Holy of Holies" was removed from later printings of this title. The book marks the first time the interior of the LDS Temple had ever been photographed for public view. Text includes commentary on other Latter-day Saint temples in Utah.





274pp. Octavo [25.5 cm] Black grained cloth with title printed on the backstrip. Very good. The title on the spine has faded. The rear pastedown has a bookbinder's label. There are two blind stamps from a previous owner on the front free endsheet and title page.

One of 500 copies. Brigham Young began keeping a daily journal early in the year of 1839, for regular entries in his journal do not appear until that time. About the same time, he wrote a short history of his life, which he then inserted in front of his daily journal. Dated and particularly detailed entries, involving the Zion's Camp march and several of his early missions, indicate that either he had kept some records of the important events in his life, or he had access to records kept by associates during those times. In 1845, Brigham Young prefaced his History with a brief life sketch of his parents and each of his brothers and sisters.
