



Tim Hildebrand's single published work. Contains a scattered handful of images, each as "trippy" as the book's contents.






A reference tool for students and researchers. Terms relating to the history of classical archaelogy are listed from a-z with biographical references given.








In spite of her limited bibliography, Tillie Olsen was a very influential author, particularly in her coverage of women's rights and class issues. Olsen began writing "Yonnondio: From the Thirties" at the age of 19, publishing an excerpt in the "Parisian Review" at 21. Due to various life obligations, the novel as it exists today was not first published until she was 61.



A collection of the late author and noted pacifist's articles, reports, and talks.










### The Tale of Peter Rabbit

The Saalfield Publishing Company, (1916). Early edition. Unpaginated. Duodecimo [18cm]; illustrated rust colored paper boards. Top board is slightly bowed. ½ centimeter loss from the head of the spine. Corners are worn. Handful of scuffs on the boards. Front hinge is cracked where the thread of the binding runs through. [55393] \$50

This is an early edition of Potter's seminal work, featuring many color and black and white illustrations.

### Souvenir Playing Cards of the Southern Lines Pacific: Sunset, Overland, Golden State Routes

[1943]. A deck of vintage playing cards, with gilt edges, in a box (with minor wear), and a tucked-in 27-page booklet containing concise information regarding the subject pictured on each card. Featured on the back of each card is Southern Pacific's streamlined "Daylight." Subjects depicted on the front of the cards include Donner Lake, Mission Carmel, Laurelhurst Park, San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge, Guest Ranch, among countless others. The deck consists of 52 playing cards, a Joker card, a card with the International Contract Bridge Score (April 1, 1943), and a card advertising the salad bowl featured on Southern Pacific dining cars. ### 9) [Deseret Alphabet]

### Deseret Second Bok by the Regents of the Deseret Yionivursiti [Deseret Alphabet Second Primer]

[Salt Lake City, UT]: [Deseret University], 1868. First edition. 72pp. Duodecimo [19 cm] 1/4 brown cloth with tan illustrated boards. The paper along the edges of the boards is a little bit chipped, and the underlying boards are exposed at the corners of the covers. The front endpaper has a thin crack along the hinge. The Deseret Alphabet was introduced in 1854, and was created by Parley P. Pratt, Heber C. Kimball and George D. Watt. Made up of thirty-eight characters to correlate with basic sounds in the English language, the Deseret Alphabet was intended to be used to help simplify the principles of the English language. The creation of the language is one the more unusual ideas of Brigham Young, and never was embraced in the way he thought it would be. The Deseret Alphabet was quickly abandoned shortly after Young's death. Flake 2818.


A bright and colorful symbolic reinterpretation by the noted Swiss artist.
