


1. Frost, Robert. A Further Range.

102pp. Octavo [22 cm] in red cloth with gilt-stamped spine and cover title. Spine gilt largely effaced from slightly faded spine, else very light wear; non-authorial ink inscription below Frost's inscription on front free endpaper, else interior is unmarked. [56218] **\$5,000**

Frost has written out the first stanza to "Neither Out Far nor In Deep" in his inscription to Estelle O'Bleness, dated July 1936, on front free endpaper.




2. Frost, Robert. West-Running Brook.




4. Frost, Robert. Collected Poems.


Signed by Leaf and Lawson on limitation page. One of 525 copies issued. A lovely story of Scottish life from the creators of Ferdinand the Bull.


6. Cather, Willa. Sapphira and the Slave Girl.

Signed by Cather on limitation page and handnumbered 56 of 525 copies. Cather's final novel examines the culture of slavery in antebellum Virginia.

Signed by Vardis Fisher on the limitation page. The DeLuxe edition of Children of God is limited to one hundred signed and numbered copies, of which this is Number 4. Children of God was the 1939 Harper Prize Novel.


Joseph M. Flora writes in Vardis Fisher, "As twentieth-century America has hastened toward an increasingly urbanized society, Vardis Fisher's life appears increasingly anachronistic. His early background hardly seems of our time. Born and reared on one of the last primitive frontiers- Annis, Idaho, a sparsely settled community of Mormons who were pioneering in the upper Snake River Valley as a part of the church's practical program of expansion- he was partly blessed and partly cursed with a heritage that enabled him as a writer to understand the course of a turbulent young America, as the genteel tradition had not allowed it to be recorded."




