


**1.** Carroll, Lewis; Margaret Tarrant. **Alice's Adventures in Wonderland.** London and Melbourne: Ward, Lock & Co., No date. The Sunshine Series. 175pp. Quarto [25 cm] 1/4 olive green cloth with illustrated paper over boards. Worn at the very extremities; text block cracked here and there; free endpapers darkened; contemporary owner's name on the front free endpaper. [54620] **\$75** 

With 24 color plates, all present, by Margaret W. Tarrant. Tarrant (1888-1959) was an English illustrator whose prolific career spanned decades and included successful versions of many children's classics such as 'Water Babies' and 'Mother Goose.' Her Alice (first published in 1916) is charming and sweet without straying into saccharine territory.





Reprint. 91pp. Octavo [22 cm] Light orange paper over boards with red lettering on the backstrip and front board. Old price sticker on the front pastedown. In a dust jacket with periodic small losses and closed tears to the edges. The deepest tear is closed, measuring 3". 

The spine is prominently rolled, the extremities are moderately bumped, and there is an area of discreet staining on the front board. [54632] **\$75** 



With 12 plates illustrated by A. B. Frost. Arthur Burdett Frost provided many illustrations for Harper's Weekly, Punch, Scribner's, and Life magazine.





**4.** Tullidge, Edward W. **The History of Salt Lake City.** Salt Lake City: Star Printing Company, 1886. Early edition. 896; 172; 36pp. Small thick quarto [24.5 cm] Brown leather lettered and decoratively stamped in gilt and blind. All edges gilt. The text block has completely come away from the spine and front cover. There is a 2" tear to the leather at the head of the spine, and a loss from the leather at the foot of the spine has been professionally restored. There is a loss from the lower portion of the title page (with no loss to the text). The rear free endpaper is absent. Quite a few of the pages have markings in pencil. [54614] **\$300**

Spine heavily rolled; rear board a bit stained; small, thin loss to fore-edge of rear cover; front hinge weak; 5" crack in the rear endsheet along the hinge; previous owner's bookplate on the front pastedown; text block cracked here and there. 

Signed by Heber J. Grant on an inscribed typed note (on Grant's letterhead) mounted to the front free endsheet. Heber J. Grant became Church President on November 23, 1918. He then went on to dedicate three new temples, develop the Welfare Program, and aid the Latter-day Saints in dealing with the tragedy of World War II. In addition, Grant's business experience helped him to modernize Church organizations and procedures, and his missionary efforts, including extensive speaking engagements and

friendships with national business leaders, gave the Church greater recognition in the United States.

One of 26 copies, lettered A-Z, signed by the author, binder, printer, and artist on the limitation page. This is copy "Z." David Lee has also signed the title page.





All edges gilt. With the ornamental metal clasp beautifully intact and completely functional. Light rubbing to the extremities. Previous owner's ink stamp on the title page; top fore-edge corners of a small amount of pages neatly folded; very rare brief markings in pencil on the pages. Overall, the binding is very attractive and the pages are exceptionally clean. Leather bound. [54570] **\$3,500** 

The New Testament is included under the title of: "The Holy Scriptures of the New Testament, translated and corrected by the spirit of revelation, Joseph Smith, Jr., the Seer." Flake: 453. Joseph Smith worked on his translation of the scriptures during the 1830's. With his death in 1844, the manuscript passed to his wife and it wasn't published until 1867. Though Smith's translations were based on the King James version of the Bible, he altered over 3,000 passages. According to

the book's preface, the translation "was done by direct revelation from God."
